MISSION



VISION


The vision for CASA of the 2nd Judicial District is to change a child's story. Our goal is to ensure every abused and neglected child has a voice in court, a friend by their side, and give them the opportunity to thrive in a safe and loving home.

YEAR-IN-REVIEW

Last year, our team of 96 volunteers made hundreds of positive, long-term impacts on the lives of children and families throughout Northeast Arkansas. Our program continued to move forward training a total of 15 new volunteers and serving more than 260 children in foster care! Our advocates gave an average of 26.76 hours of volunteer service in 2023. They were by a child's side ensuring their needs were met, a safe and permanent home was identified and thoroughly vetted, the court had a tremendous amount of information to base their decisions on, and were there to listen and provide constant encouragement. Our Building Better Futures program continued to focus on instilling life skills in aging youth in foster care and connecting young adults with career opportunities. We also began celebrating families who achieved reunification and continued to provide a new teddy bear to every child adopted through our Friends For Life program!



CHILDREN DEMOGRAPHICS



AGE 21-29: 16% 30-39: 32% 40-49: 16% 50-59: 20% 60+: 16%


